V'Shinantam – And You Shall Teach Them "THE SWIM TEST"

When I was at my college orientation, our advisor explained to us the requirements we would need to meet in order to graduate. She listed the subject distributions and the various courses and other requirements we would need to meet. And then she said, "And don't forget the swim test."

Swim test? Yes, a swim test. Decades earlier, a college alum lost his son because he didn't know how to swim, and in memorializing him at the college, he insisted the school ensure that every graduate know how to swim.

Here in south Florida, most of us as parents make sure our children learn to swim. As parents, it's our job to make responsibilities as parents.

In our society today we work hard at two out of the three. We do all we can to provide a strong education for our children, to make sure they attend strong schools and learn as best they can. We provide them opportunities to explore their interests and build strong bodies. We teach them to swim.

But we need to apply the same level of care and intention to our children's moral and spiritual upbringing. We need to be intentional in teaching our children what are our essential values and principles. We need to help our children learn moral judgment and right from wrong. We need to help them to discover their identities

sure our children are safe, and that we teach them skills necessary not simply to survive, but thrive.

In the Talmud, in tractate Kiddushin, we learn that a parent is obligated to teach a child certain things, including Torah and a trade – but we also learn that a parent is obligated to teach a child to swim. Children need to learn a trade to provide for their physical well-being, they need to learn Torah to build their moral character and spiritual core, and they need to learn to swim to be able to ensure their personal safety. If we do not educate our children and prepare them for adulthood, we have not fulfilled our by telling them where they come from, who they are, and what we believe.

In the Torah, one of the most central commands we must observe as parents is *"V'Shinantam LVanecha –* You shall teach it to your children." And Temple Beth El takes seriously the sacred trust a synagogue shares with parents in fulfilling this commandment.

For the last year, a talented and dedicated group of congregational leaders, parents, educators, and staff have explored what Jewish education at Temple Beth El ought to be. What should our children feel when they walk in their synagogue? What should they experience



in their classes and activities? What structures will work best with our busy schedules? What modalities tend to be the most engaging? How can we build a program where our children feel inspired to learn, where they build communities and friendships, where they learn to embrace the wisdom of their people's texts, traditions, language, history, and moral frameworks and spiritual truths?

These are monumental questions, and the answers continue to unfold. But it is essential that we teach our children how our Jewish tradition teaches us how to build resilience and emotional wellbeing, self-confidence and self-respect, social consciousness and communal responsibility, relationship skills and moral decision-making.

Together we will build a Jewish learning center at Temple Beth El where our children have the tools to build a world on the outside that is filled with understanding and justice and goodness, and a world on the inside that is filled with wisdom, compassion, and peace.

While we will be making use of new methodologies and techniques that allow for more effective, enjoyable and convenient teaching, we are not changing our steadfast commitment to help our children and parents be the best people that they can be regardless of their job, school or team.

Updated programs include family learning opportunities that are meaningful and engaging for parents and kids alike. These programs will provide an essential environment and framework for parents and children to reinforce their bond while teaching the moral framework (found in Torah and our traditions) and religious education, and fostering community.

Other programs will include different modes and methods of learning more technical subjects such as Hebrew language. Beth El is embracing the best and most effective teaching techniques and technologies to make learning as enjoyable and effective as possible.

– Learning will be more convenient, both in terms of time and location.

So while some things are changing, Beth El remains dedicated to make sure that when children and families get to where they are going, the journey was meaningful and not an empty experience.

Construction activities at the Schaefer Family Campus continue full speed ahead as we get closer to completing this multi-year project. **Phase Two**, which we anticipate will be complete in the summer of 2019, includes most of the public spaces that will have the most dramatic impact on our members and on our worship and learning experiences.

Phase Two includes

- the new covered drop off area
- welcome center
- inspiring new chapel
- adult learning room
- Sisterhood gift shop and
- expanded and renovated rest rooms

Phase Three, the final phase of the Project which contains most of the administrative offices, will begin this summer and be complete in early 2020.

An exciting feature we are incorporating into the project is a **state-of-the-art digital display wall.** This digital wall includes five 55inch monitors, two of which are interactive and will display all sorts of things that we want to highlight for our members and guests.



Over a decade ago, Lynn University almost threw away a set of books from the Nuremberg Trials. Known as the Blue Series, Rabbi Mates, rescued them from destruction and has for the last ten years brought together hundreds of attorneys to learn about these trials that used the Rule of Law to bring order to a post-Holocaust, post-WWII world. Several events will mark this 10th anniversary of what has come to be known as Project Nuremberg. Project Nuremberg is generously underwritten by Marilyn and Jay Weinberg.



It's Graduation!

What's so special about a preschool graduation? According to Merriam Webster, a graduation is the award or acceptance of an academic degree or diploma. Are preschoolers engaged in academics? Do they "deserve" a diploma?

Harvard research shows in the first few years of life, more than 1 million new neural connections are formed every second. The brain architecture is built over time and shaped through experiences.

We also know that what happens early matters for a lifetime and it's better to get it right the first time than to try and fix something later on. Development and the impact of experience on development is a back and forth interaction. We also know that we cannot separate cognitive development from social/emotional development. Emotionally and socially confident children are more productive in learning.

So how does the early learning center experience factor into all of this?

When a child experiments with handson learning opportunities, the goal is to intentionally combine prior knowledge with something new so that the experience becomes something unique and the learning is enhanced. The other thing that is essential for children is "play". Play allows children to use their creativity, while creating healthy brain development. Through play children engage and interact with the world around them. Our days are filled with multi-sensory experiences, positive guidance, structure, love and warmth. Our children are engaged, involved, enquiring and problem solving.

There is a famous quote from Benjamin Franklin that says "Tell me and I forget. Teach me and I remember. Involve me and I learn".

The preschool experience is all about creating the foundation for what comes later in life and shapes our learning capacity for the future. I think that is truly worthy of a celebration...with or without a diploma.

This is a permanent fix and serves to get rid of the pain from the broken bone and prevent further collapse of the bone so you don't become deformed and hunched over. The pain is gone immediately and you can walk out of the office with just a Band- Aid! Skilled in the most advanced surgical techniques and menoring technologies.
