Vision

According to the American Optometric Association, 20/20 vision is a term used to express normal visual acuity. If you have 20/20 vision, you can see clearly at 20 feet what should normally be seen at that distance. But Dr. Tim Johnson of the University of Iowa says that only 35 percent of Americans actually have 20/20 vision.

I first got eyeglasses when I was ten years old, and my vision has gotten progressively worse over time. When I take off my glasses for a haircut, it becomes a faith-based experience.

But Judaism has taught for centuries that vision has very little to do with our eyesight. The things that matter most in life are seldom the things we perceive with our eyes.

When we look around, we see the world as it is. But even with our eyes wide open, our gaze does not always capture all there truly is to see. We

For centuries, Judaism offered a vision where we partner with God to spread holiness and righteousness throughout the world. Moses lifted his eyes to see a bush aflame but unconsumed, and led our people from slavery through the wilderness to a promised land. Our prophets shared a vision which demanded they call our people to righteousness and justice. Our rabbis and sages learned to see seventy facets of meaning in every word of Torah. Modern philosophers and theologians saw new ways of understanding God and how to renew our covenant with the Holy One in our own time. The leaders of Zionism gave us a vision of our people reborn and renewed in the land of Israel.

Our tradition teaches that we are not simply a people of vision but of action. It is not enough to have a vision of what the world is supposed to be – we have



partnerships that lift up the poor, that protect the vulnerable, and that create justice for the oppressed. We all must come together to bring relief and healing to those who are wanting.

We seek also to build a State of Israel that is strong and secure, a country that cultivates a garden of Jewish religious culture and life, and that supports a pluralistic vision that embraces the destiny of all those who live there. This is why I implore you to vote in the elections for the World Zionist Congress, so that we can work to make that vision a reality. (See p. 18 for details).

As we begin the year 2020, may we lift our eyes to see the vision God shared with our people at Sinai, a vision we carried with us through the centuries, a vision of a world that is blessed with healing, with love, with justice, and with peace. And may that vision inspire us to work to see it realized soon and in our days.

Beth El's High School Program is a "Must" for Teens

I am grateful that my children are no longer teens (my youngest is now 22 years old) because raising them was very scary for me and my wife.

Our kids were "good kids" but still we were always in fear of what would happen next.

Our children kept on asking us "adult" questions that we were uncomfortable to answer.

Sex, drugs, underage drinking, driving (including accidents), relationships, morality, college, money, self-confidence, mean girls, mean boys, boyfriends, girlfriends, bad teachers, college applications, success, failure, materialism, internet trolls and things that they heard on the news, were all topics that at one point or another we dealt with.

My wife and I looked for help raising our kids. Unfortunately, because of age and infirmary, our parents weren't a good source of wisdom and guidance.

Academic school programs provided some guidance, but mostly the job of high school teachers is to teach academic subjects and prepare kids for college.

And, that's where Beth El's High School education helped; our daughter learned about life, morality, and the difference between right and wrong. Beth El's post Bar/Bat Mitzvah program

shifted its emphasis from getting her ready for Bat Mitzvah to teaching about life after high school.

Our clergy and instructors facilitated discussion and thought about how to make good choices, establish priorities, avoid getting into trouble, deal with social pressures, persevere through hardship, adversity and failure, and understand the world around us. There were even classes on financial literacy and paying for college.

When my daughter was in Beth El's High School program the only class she wanted to talk about was Beth El. My daughter's most animated conversations with me were when she told me about challenging Rabbi Levin on an issue of morality. While our daughter never spontaneously told us anything about math, science or English class, we always immediately heard what she thought about Rabbi Levin's latest lesson.

One parent recently told me that Beth El's High School Program is like "lightning in a bottle" and, that we need to get the word out about the incredible value of our High School Program. And, I am pretty certain that our teenagers agree.

That's our challenge for 2020...to make sure that everyone knows that Beth El's High School curriculum deals with the most important things in life and is a "must" for our teens.

THIS NEW DATABASE AND ACCOUNTING MANAGEMENT SYSTEM WILL MAKE MANAGING YOUR ACCOUNT SO MUCH EASIER!

ShulCloud is Temple Beth El's new cloud-based, integrated software program which will ultimately incorporate our:

- member database
- · calendar of events
- event registration
- accounting functions

- website platform
- temple-wide communications
- on-line member portal . . . and more.

We will launch the heart of ShulCloud, the member database and portal, in the first quarter 2020. The other functions will be rolled out over the next six months. We will update the congregation as we bring forward new elements of the software.

When we launch the on-line member portal, you will be able to log into your account to:

- view and update personal information
- view account balances and make payments online
- view and manage yahrzeits
- opt in or out of e-news subscriptions
- view events on the calendar and then register and pay within your account
- save a credit card on file to your secure account
- request paperless monthly statements by e-mail

ShulCloud also has an app available for free download on Apple I-Tunes or Android Google Play which will allow you to do many Temple transactions from your mobile phone or tablet once things are up and running.

We will roll out various elements of ShulCloud over the next several months. During this time, we ask for your patience should there be any delays or errors on your account. We are migrating an enormous volume of data from our current database to ShulCloud, and there is always the possibility that not all information will transfer correctly despite our extensive accuracy checks. We encourage you to check your statements from the Temple and please let us know if you find anything that appears incorrect. Stay tuned for future updates on ShulCloud!







This Financial Report Card is intended to provide our members with a brief overview of the Temple's financial results for the 2018-2019 fiscal year which ended on June 30, 2019. Financial transparency is very important to our Board of Trustees. We hope this Report Card will give our members the information necessary to be confident that we are on solid financial ground.

A BALANCED BUDGET

We finished the 2018-2019 fiscal year with a balanced budget for the seventh year in a row. Revenues from operations exceeded operating expenses by approximately \$65,000. The excess funds will be transferred to capital reserves which are in need of replenishment. \$1.6 million of existing capital reserves were used last year for deferred maintenance items such as exterior painting, roof replacements and HVAC replacements undertaken concurrently with the major renovation projects at the Schaefer Family Campus and Beck Family Campus. As a result, our capital reserves are below normal levels and we are committed to replenishing them over the next several years so that our new facilities will remain in good working order for the foreseeable future without having to impose special assessments on the membership.

REVENUE AND EXPENSES


The Temple's major revenue and expense categories as a percentage of total budget are in line with similarly sized congregations according to a benchmarking survey by the Union for Reform Judaism ("URJ"). One area where Temple Beth El is different, in a good way, than other large Reform congregations is the percentage of overall operating revenues that come from Congregational Commitment (formerly known as "Membership Dues"). Our Congregational Commitment revenues make up [25%] of total revenues, which is roughly half of the national average. The reason is that Beth El has

multiple, significant and diversified revenue streams including Mausoleum Sales, Charter School facility rental revenue, Early Learning Center ("ELC") tuition, Religious School tuition, catering services revenue, and substantial fundraising, all of which make our Temple far less reliant on Congregational Commitments than our peers. This is a positive attribute because it allows us to keep Congregational Commitment rates from getting too high and it enables us to better withstand economic downturns.

MEMBERSHIP

The Temple's overall membership in terms of number of households, has remained relatively flat for the past three years. We finished the fiscal year on June 30, 2019 with 1,502 member households, compared to 1,504 in 2018 and 1528 in 2017.

RELIGIOUS SCHOOL ENROLLMENT

Religious School enrollment at the conclusion of the 2018-2019 academic year stood at 492 students, nearly identical to the same time the prior year when we finished the year with 493 students. This is the first time in recent history that we have not seen a year-over-year material drop in total student enrollment. We believe

this favorable trend is due to a combination of (i) a growing Early Learning Center that is providing a pipeline of young children into the Religious School, and (ii) new and creative Religious School initiatives aimed at satisfying the needs of modern Jewish families.

EARLY LEARNING CENTER ENROLLMENT

Early Learning Center ("ELC") enrollment at the conclusion of the 2018-2019 academic year was 244 students, compared to 222 students at the same time in the prior year, representing a 10% increase year-over-year. The Beth El ELC has been growing steadily and consistently since it opened in 2009. Last year the campus was expanded to include, among other things, six new classrooms. Three of these new classrooms are already filled with

ELC students and we anticipate filling the rest in the near future. There is a high demand for our ELC due to the excellent reputation we have built in the local community, with waiting lists for most grades. With the continuation of new residential construction in West Delray and West Boynton Beach, we do not foresee a reduction in demand for our ELC program in the foreseeable future.

BETH EL MAUSOLEUM

The Beth El Mausoleum continues to provide a meaningful final resting place for our synagogue members and members of the surrounding Jewish community. Gross sales revenue for the 2018-2019 fiscal year was just under \$1 million, compared to about \$1.4 million the year before. We believe this decline was primarily due to a pricing strategy implemented to preserve in-

ventory of premium locations, as well as the ongoing construction at the Schaefer Family Campus which may have been a barrier to purchase. We are hopeful that the new facilities will provide comfort and inspiration to our community and increase our ability to attract potential purchasers.



OUR FUNDRAISING

FULFILLING THE PROMISE CAPITAL AND ENDOWMENT CAMPAIGN

We should all be extraordinarily proud of the success of the Fulfilling the Promise ("FTP") Campaign. Thanks to the generosity of approximately 733 unique donor households, we have been able to build the facilities to achieve our dreams of creating a physical space as modern and inspirational as our program, educational and spiritual offerings.

Total funds available to complete the Schaefer Family Campus and Beck Family Campus expansion and renovation projects stand at \$24,300,000. This figure includes (i) gifts already received, (ii) pledge commitments that are formalized but not yet received, (iii) legacy gifts and other expectancies we expect to realize in the next eight years, and (iv) future net income from ELC tuition associated with the newly constructed classrooms at the Beck Campus.

The Beck Family Campus expansion is complete. Total construction costs came in at just under \$4.6 million, including all soft costs, architecture and engineering fees, as well as furniture, fixtures and equipment ("FF&E").

The Schaefer Family Campus expansion and renovation project will be complete by the summer of 2020. We expect this project to cost approximately \$17.4 million including all soft costs,

architecture and engineering fees, artwork and décor, as well as FF&E.

Because many of the large gifts we received for this campaign are paid out over an extended period of time, the Temple has a construction loan in place with Wells Fargo Bank. Financing costs over the life of the loan are expected to total roughly \$2.3 million, resulting in total project costs, including financing expenses, of \$24.3 million.

FINANCIAL TRANSPARENCY

LOAN OBLIGATIONS AND THE PLAN TO BE DEBT-FREE

Although we have funds and future commitments to pay for our current construction projects, there still remains \$3.7 million of outstanding debt from the original construction of the Beck Family Campus in 2009. We presently do not have the funds or future commitments to retire that debt. We have also taken on a construction bridge loan to pay for the recent construction and renovation projects while we wait for payments to come in over the next several years from pledges which will be paid out over an extended period of time.

After completion of Phase 3 of the Schaefer Family Campus

renovation project in the summer of 2020, we will have roughly \$10.3 million of outstanding debt at a fixed rate of 3.92% interest per year. Our top priority is to pay down this debt as quickly as possible.

As a result, we will continue the FTP campaign with a goal of raising approximately \$3.7 million between now and the loan maturity date of July 5, 2027. If we can do that, we will be completely debt free, including the original debt from the construction of the Beck Campus in 2009. That is our primary fundraising initiative for this coming year.

AUDIT

We hope you find this financial report card informative. This is not intended to be a detailed financial statement, but rather a high level summary of our financial results from the 2018-2019 year.

Thanks to the ongoing support of our members, the generosity of our benefactors, and the hard work of our incredible staff, Temple Beth El stands on solid financial footing. The 2018-2019 year was another successful one economically and we are blessed with the good fortune of having such a strong and supportive Jewish community in Boca Raton.

Financial transparency is very important to us. The Temple

hires independent auditors from an outside accounting firm every year to audit our books and our financial controls. The results of the audit are presented to the Finance Committee and the Board of Trustees. Undergoing a full third-party audit every year is both time consuming and costly. But we feel it is time and money well spent. We always want our members to feel comfortable that we are operating at the highest levels of financial integrity. 

Keeping It In Perspective

In our fast paced world, it feels like we are all moving at top speed all of the time. It is very easy to feel stressed and overwhelmed. Studies show that even children are more frequently experiencing these uncomfortable states. In our society, we often will tell children to "pay attention" or "calm down," yet we often don't spend the time teaching them how.

In an effort to address this challenge at the Beth El Early Learning Center, we decided to experiment with incorporating lessons of mindfulness into our curriculum plan this year. Research shows that practicing mindfulness

with children supports increased focus, decreased stress and anxiety, and positive prosocial behavior. We used staff development workshops to begin training our staff in mindfulness practices for themselves, and then ways to incorporate these opportunities into the daily routines of their classrooms. The purpose is to give the children skills to develop their awareness of their inner and outer experiences and emotions; to enable them to recognize when their attention has wandered and teach them valuable tools for impulse control to return to equilibrium. We are starting to see results in the children's behavior in school.

These tools are not only effective in the classroom, but are even more valuable when reinforced at home. Mindfulness can sound daunting, but many of us already incorporate some routines into our days that we may not realize. It can be a great way to connect with your child and find a moment of tranquility together in an otherwise hectic day.

Here are some ground rules...

LET GO OF EXPECTATIONS - Mindfulness is not a miracle cure to stop tantrums or consistently keep an active child calm, but over time it will give them tools to center themselves in times of need.

DON'T FORCE IT - If your child isn't interested in a particular exercise, let it go.

IT IS NOT INTENDED AS A PUNISHMENT - Building a mindfulness practice with your child will be most successful if you teach the exercises when they are calm, happy and peaceful, rather than when upset or nervous.

There are many resources available online, but here are some easy activities to get you started...

Incorporate mindfulness into your bedtime rituals

BREATHING BUDDY - Rest a favorite stuffed animal on your child's chest and have them watch it rise and fall with their breath. Count together to regulate their breath, than allow them to do it silently.

Focus on different parts of their body as they breathe deeply

Share a daily gratitude with each other **THREE BREATH HUG** - Hug your child. Relax as you take three deliberate, synchronized breaths together. This is great for good-byes or when someone is feeling nervous.

STOP AND BE AWARE GAME - When you find yourself waiting in a doctor's office, standing in line at the grocery store, or walking through a parking lot, pause to encourage your child to tune into their 5 senses then share what you notice around you.

If you'd like to learn more, the Early Learning Center is offering a series of Parent Workshops teaching these practices. Check our website and emails for more information about these upcoming programs.

When we teach mindfulness to children, we are sharing skillful ways of relating to life's uncomfortable and challenging moments. The earlier we do so in their young lives, the greater the opportunity to help them cultivate resilience, pay attention, calm down, and make better decisions. What better gift than that!




