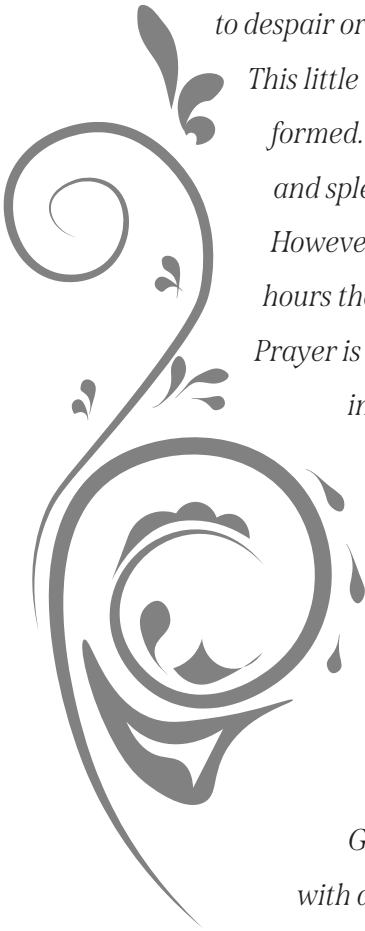

Remembrance and Resilience: October 7, 2023

In distress I called on the Eternal;
God answered me and brought me relief.
Adonai is with me, I have no fear; what can humanity do to me?

In the year 38 CE, the Jewish community of Alexandria found itself in a vulnerable place. Caught in a struggle between the Roman emperor Caligula and the Greek community of Alexandria, the Jewish grandson of Herod, Herod Agrippa, was sent to Alexandria to impose Roman rule. The Roman prefect for Egypt, Flaccus, invaded Alexandria's synagogues, demanding they post sculptures of Caligula in their sacred sanctuaries.

When the Jews pushed back on Flaccus, he responded with fury. "They slew them and thousands of others," wrote Philo of Alexandria, "with all kinds of agony and tortures, and newly invented cruelties ... the most merciless of all their persecutors in some instances burnt whole families, husbands with their wives, and infant children with their parents ..."

Some call this the first recorded pogrom - an organized massacre of a Jewish community. It would not be the last.



For two thousand years, our people have known the anxious dread of vulnerability. From the time we were first expelled from our home in

the land of Israel more than 2,500 years ago, to the Roman campaign to quash the Judean revolt, through centuries of wandering across nearly every continent of the world, the fear of pogrom sat either in the back of our minds or the forefront of our fears.

Our history is punctuated by moments of massacre: the fall of the Bar Kochba revolt and the martyrdom of our rabbis, attacks by Crusaders, Muslim radicals in Morocco, Inquisitors in Spain, pogroms in Odessa, Warsaw, Kishinev, Kiev, Bialystok. And later, Kristallnacht, the Night of Broken Glass, the event which kicked in the door to genocide and Holocaust.

These I recall, and my soul melts with sorrow;
For the bitter course of our history,
Tears pour from my eyes...

With the birth of the State of Israel, we thought we were safe at home. We hoped our homeland would be strong enough to solve our eternal vulnerability, to finally inoculate us against the persistent virus of antisemitism.

But over the years, too many lives were shattered in battle, too many killed for the simple crime of standing at a bus stop, grabbing a drink at a cafe, partying with friends at a dance-club, or feeding a child a piece of pizza.

And so, through the ingenuity and creativity of engineers, and the valor and bravery of determined soldiers, we sought to repel our enemies. We built our lives under an Iron Dome and constructed playground equipment where our children could hide from an incoming rocket. We added safe-rooms to our homes, and with every “Red Alert” waited patiently for the “All Clear”.

But the morning of October 7, 2023 our vulnerability returned. Israel awoke at dawn to an onslaught of rocketfire and Red Alerts.

Instinctively, many rose quickly and went into the safe-rooms of their homes, following the ritual they had practiced countless times.

This would not be like the other times. This would not be like the other days. This morning of *Simchat Torah* would not be one of dancing and joy, but of carnage and horror unlike any we have known since the *Shoah*.



TESTIMONY OF EDEN R.

I was the officer on duty over the weekend with just 13 soldiers on the Urim Southern District Base. Everything was quiet and peaceful as usual.

At 6:30 in the morning there were sirens and missiles so we ran straight to the *Migunit* - the concrete shelters in the dormitories - in flip-flops, pajamas and with a weapon. We waited there a bit and then started to hear rumors that terrorists had infiltrated the base, but we didn't believe it. But then we started to hear shots being fired.

We ran to the Operations Room, the most protected area on the base. As we ran, the terrorists started to run after us, shooting at us, and I was shot in the leg. I continued to run barefoot like a crazy person without looking back.

When I got inside, we bandaged my leg with a shirt from one of the Operations Sergeants and we waited there to be rescued. Unfortunately, rescue was not anywhere on the horizon.

Then we started to hear the terrorists detonating explosives around the Operations Room as they attempted to get inside to us. For half an hour we heard shooting and grenades. All we could do was pray for the best. Door by door they got through until the only door left was the one that separated us from them.

I started sending goodbye messages to all my loved ones.

They blew up the last door, came into the room, and shot at us without pause, screaming. When they were done, they waited a little, spoke in Arabic, searched for documents, checked that we were dead, and then left. I wasn't sure if I was dead or alive. I felt dead, but I

could still see and hear and feel. I waited for the final bullet that would hit me and kill me, but it never came.

After four hours of playing dead, while I was in so much pain but I couldn't say a word, angels came to save me. They took me to Soroka Hospital [in Be'er Sheva] and on the way I immediately asked to call my family and tell them that I was alive against all odds!

I had been shot 12 times - bullets in my legs, my left hand and my shoulder. I thank God who watched over me and was with me in that room. I still can't believe that I am here, that I am alive and that with the help of God I should regain full function. It is simply a miracle.

TESTIMONY OF YASMEEN P.

My partner Tal and I were at the NOVA festival. At 6:30 in the morning an insane missile barrage suddenly started. We quickly went into the car and started driving toward Kibbutz Be'eri - we thought we would be safe there. The alert squad told us terrorists had penetrated the kibbutz, and we should get out of there.

But Tal suggested we try to take shelter in one of the houses. We knocked on the door of a couple around 70 years old - Hadas and Adi

Dagan. We explained that we had fled from the party and asked if we could hide with them in their safe room. They agreed and we sat together watching the news, realizing that we were the news.

Hadas learned that the terrorists were next door, and I wrote farewell notes to my three children. Tal and I hid in a wardrobe, but when the terrorists couldn't get into the safe room, they threw a grenade. There was a huge explosion, and I heard Hadas begging for her life. They took Hadas and Adi, and a few minutes later, they took Tal and me as well.

They took us to a building where another fifteen hostages sat inside, some wounded from gunshots, one lying dead in the doorway. About forty terrorists patrolled the yard and the building. Calmly I tried speaking with them. One spoke Hebrew and I said: "Please don't kill me. I'm the mother of three children." He replied: "We won't kill you. We just want to take you to Gaza."

The same terrorist told me to call the police to make sure they could leave safely with their hostages. After several hours going back and forth with the police, he decided to surrender. Using me as a shield we walked out toward the police. I screamed at the soldiers: "Don't shoot! Don't shoot!"

We continued to move forward when suddenly, he thrust me toward the police, who caught me and him as well. I was saved, but Tal was murdered. And Adi too. Hadas, his wife, was released several hours later - wounded and in shock. All the others were murdered. We are the only two of the hostages to survive.

As the day wore on, the magnitude of the horror began to unfold. Children slaughtered in their beds. Families burned alive in their homes. Parents murdered in front of their children. Children murdered before their parents' eyes. More than 250 men, women, elderly, and children abducted and taken hostage. Sexual assault too gruesome to name.

Thousands of terrorists had perpetrated the greatest massacre of Jews in one day since the Holocaust. And yet, even in the midst of the onslaught, still there were those whose humanity propelled them to acts of extraordinary heroism and sacrifice.

DR. DANIEL LEVY

Dr. Daniel Levy was born in San Isidro, Peru. His family had migrated to South America at the beginning of the 20th century and settled in the Inca country. From a very young age, Daniel was active in the Zionist youth movement *HaNoar HaTzioni*, attended Jewish school and was active in the local Jewish community. He had always wanted to be a doctor, and realized his dream at the age of 25. For two years he practiced his profession in northern Peru.

In 2016, he decided to make aliyah and settle in Israel. As a doctor, he soon enlisted in the Israeli army as a military doctor. After his service, he joined the Soroka Hospital in Be'er Sheva, where he began to specialize as an ENT. He married Lihi, and together they

had two children - Emma, 4 and Liam, almost 2. Daniel and his family chose to settle in Kibbutz Be'eri, to be close to the hospital and to make a life in the idyllic kibbutz.

When the sirens began ringing in the kibbutz early on the morning of October 7, the family went into their bomb shelter. Then Daniel was called to the kibbutz clinic to help treat the many people wounded in onslaught by Hamas.

“He gave me a kiss and he left,” Lihi said. He updated her throughout the day that they were running out of supplies, afraid of the terrorists still roaming the kibbutz. Then terrorists threw a grenade into the clinic, and he was killed.

An injured member of the Be'eri local security force whom Daniel treated in his final hours told about his bravery in the face of the terrorists and the care he gave to the wounded. He noted his calm demeanor, and his kind eyes, that was so like him.

Lihi said that Daniel always knew he would become a doctor, “but at the moment of truth when he ran to save lives, there was nobody to save him.”

SGT. EDEN ALON LEVY

Eden Alon Levy was born and raised in Nirit, a rural communal in central Israel, the fourth of five children. As a girl, Eden loved music and languages, and especially loved to dance.

Eden was stationed at Zikim, a military training base just five kilometers north of Gaza City. A group of 90 newly enlisted soldiers had arrived at the base in late August, and Eden was among the officers responsible for their training.

At 6:30 in the morning, an enormous barrage of rockets targeted the base, and within minutes, Eden helped gather all the rookies in the *Migunit* - the concrete shelter on base. She then ran to the base's firing range with two other female officers, 2nd Lt. Adar Ben Simon, and Sgt. Ron.

An hour later, they saw nine Hamas soldiers running toward their position, shooting and firing grenades. Returning fire, Ron was struck in her head.

Another soldier, Sgt. Noa Elon, came to help but she too was wounded. Eden and Adar continued to fight, doing everything within their power to repel the attack.

“The bullet sliced my scalp but was stopped by my helmet,” said Ron. “Noa was hurt really badly. I gave my gun to Eden who went on returning fire...”

The battle grew more intense. “Reinforcement at the firing ranges,” Eden wrote in an urgent message at 8:06. “Reinforcement at firing range – urgent,” company commander Adar Ben Simon echoed. Then two minutes later, she added, “We’re under fire. There are around four [terrorists] here.”

Nine minutes passed. “They have grenades,” Adar reported. “Reinforcement required!!!” At 8:10 she added, “Soon we’ll run out of bullets. Urgent reinforcement requested.” Not a minute passed and Eden voiced a similar plea. “We need help. Firing range. Ammunition has run out.”

In those same seconds she also messaged the WhatsApp group consisting of her parents and four siblings. "I love you," she wrote. Her mother, who could not imagine that her daughter was texting them from the depths of hell, replied with a smiley emoji blowing a heart-shaped kiss. Two minutes later, Eden managed to report to the command post that someone was wounded. The clock showed 8:13. It was the last sign of life to come from the sentry position at the firing range.

All 90 of the new recruits were saved.

CHIEF INSPECTOR ARNON ZAMORA

When he was in second grade, Arnon Zamora dressed up as a Paratrooper. Instead, he went into the National Police Counter-Terrorism Unit.

On October 7, as the terror attack began to unfold, Arnon left his wife, Michal, and their young children to defend his country. He went to multiple kibbutzim to fight off terrorists and bring Israelis to safety.

Several months later in June, Arnon was called once again. Intelligence had located four hostages who had been taken from the Nova Dance Festival: Noa Argamani, Almong Meir Jan, Andrey Kozlov, and Shlomi Ziv. He kissed his family goodbye, not knowing it would be for the last time.

As Arnon and his team infiltrated the Nuseirat refugee camp in central Gaza, the air was thick with tension. Finally, they reached the buildings where the hostages were held. The rescue operation began smoothly, but soon chaos erupted. Dozens of Hamas terrorists, hidden in the building, opened fire. The small rooms filled with smoke and the deafening sound of gunfire. Arnon, leading from the front, fought to protect his team and the hostages.

In the midst of the battle, Arnon was hit. As medics rushed to his aid, the fight raged on around them. As the fight raged around them, Arnon's team refused to leave their critically wounded leader.

Through sheer determination and courage, the Israeli forces managed to extract the hostages and their fallen commander. As helicopters whisked them away from the war-torn streets of Gaza, medics fought desperately to save Arnon's life.

Tragically, Arnon succumbed to his wounds shortly after reaching the hospital. He was 36.

“In the end, the children and I will be fine,” his wife Michal said through tears. “They will know how much of a hero their father was, how many lives he saved ... but much more than that, they will remember how much fun they had with you. Riding bikes, playing the guitar, lighting a bonfire, eating ice cream, having fun together, and being a family.”

ANER ELYAKIM SHAPIRA and HERSH GOLDBERG-POLIN

After a holiday dinner with his family, Aner Shapira, an off-duty soldier on vacation from the infantry brigade, went to the NOVA festival to unwind and celebrate with friends. An aspiring musician, Aner had previously composed and produced five songs, and was hoping the festival would inspire his newest composition.

The desert air was electric with music and laughter as thousands of young people danced through the night. But as the sun rose, the festival grounds became a killing field.

Aner and his friend, Hersh Goldberg-Polin, ran to a small roadside shelter, filled with dozens of others, all trying to escape.

Panic spread through the crowd, and immediately, Aner tried to calm everyone down. “Guys, don’t worry!” he called out. “I’m a soldier, my comrades are nearby, I’m here. Everything will be all right!”

Hersh had recently finished his army service. Like many Israelis after their service, Hersh was planning to travel the world. He had been working on an initiative to use soccer to bring Israeli and Palestinian children together.

Hiding inside, they heard the terrorists approach. Suddenly a grenade was tossed into the crowded shelter. Quickly Aner grabbed the grenade and tossed it back into the street. Again, a grenade flew into the shelter, and just as quickly, Aner lobbed it back out the entrance. Again and again, they grabbed the grenades, and threw them out. But then a grenade exploded and killed Aner. Hersh refused to give up, and took the place of his fallen friend. As he grabbed yet another grenade, it exploded, tearing off his left arm below the elbow. Believing the end was near, Hersh texted his mother, “I’m sorry.”

Hersh was among the more than 250 people taken hostage into Gaza. In the weeks and months to follow, his parents Rachel and Jon

traveled the world, marking the days of their son's captivity in masking tape on their chest. With grit and determination, with strength and eloquence, they pleaded for their son's release.

ONE TINY SEED by Rachel Goldberg-Polin

There is a lullaby that says your mother will cry a thousand tears before you grow to be a man.

I have cried a million tears in the last 67 days.

We all have.

And I know that way over there
there's another woman
who looks just like me
because we are all so very similar
and she has also been crying.

All those tears, a sea of tears
they all taste the same.

Can we take them
gather them up,
remove the salt
and pour them over our desert of despair
and plant one tiny seed.

A seed wrapped in fear,
trauma, pain,
war and hope
and see what grows?

Could it be
that this woman
so very like me
that she and I could be sitting together in 50 years
laughing without teeth
because we have drunk so much sweet tea together
and now we are so very old
and our faces are creased
like worn-out brown paper bags.

And our sons
have their own grandchildren
and our sons have long lives
One of them without an arm
But who needs two arms anyway?

Is it all a dream?
A fantasy? A prophecy?

One tiny seed.

After more than 330 days in captivity, Hersh, along with five other hostages - Carmel Gat, Eden Yerushalmi, Alexander Lobanov, Almog Sarusi and Ori Danino - were found killed on August 31, 2024, executed as IDF soldiers approached.

In eulogizing her son, Rachel Goldberg-Polin said:

“Hersh, for all of these months I have been in such torment worrying about you every millisecond of everyday. It was such a specific type of misery that I have never experienced before. I tried hard to suppress the “missing you” part. Because that, I was convinced, would break me. So I spent 330 days terrified, scared, worrying, and frightened. It closed my throat and made my soul throb with 3rd degree burns.

“Part of what is so deeply crushing and confusing for us is that a strange thing happened along this macabre path upon which our family found itself traveling for the past 332 days. Amidst the inexplicable agony, terror, anguish, desperation and fear....we became absolutely CERTAIN, that you were coming home to us ALIVE. But it was not to be.”



In America, we often speak of “The Greatest Generation” - those who grew up through the Great Depression, went to war to vanquish fascism, returned home to build businesses and careers, families and lives on a foundation of humility, service, decency, and sacrifice.

In Israel, when asked who comprises the “Greatest Generation,” many will say: “Our young people today.” Despite the fact that young people bore the brunt of Hamas’ aggression on October 7, it is the young people whose spirit of service and sacrifice, of pride in their people and commitment to their country that has inspired the people of Israel.

For months, on the battlefield, in cities and towns, they offer their lives to safeguard their homeland, to restore the hostages to their families, and to ensure that the land and people of Israel stays safe and strong. They support one another in raising children with missing parents, in holding businesses together, in keeping each other sane. Despite their heartbreak and agony, they keep the flame of hope alive.

Capturing their spirit, was Eden Golan, a young songwriter whose music captured the world at the European Song Contest. Braving antisemitic attacks, she held her head high, and let her voice soar even higher, as she offered the collective prayer for our people that while our hearts may be broken, our spirits remain strong.

As we enter into this New Year, as we consider the path we will take in our lives, let us imagine we stand face to face with the thousands who perished on October 7, and the thousands since who were killed, wounded, and displaced in Israel's mission to secure its borders and people. Let the choices and the lives we lead attest to the sanctity of their memories, and give honor and purpose to their sacrifice.

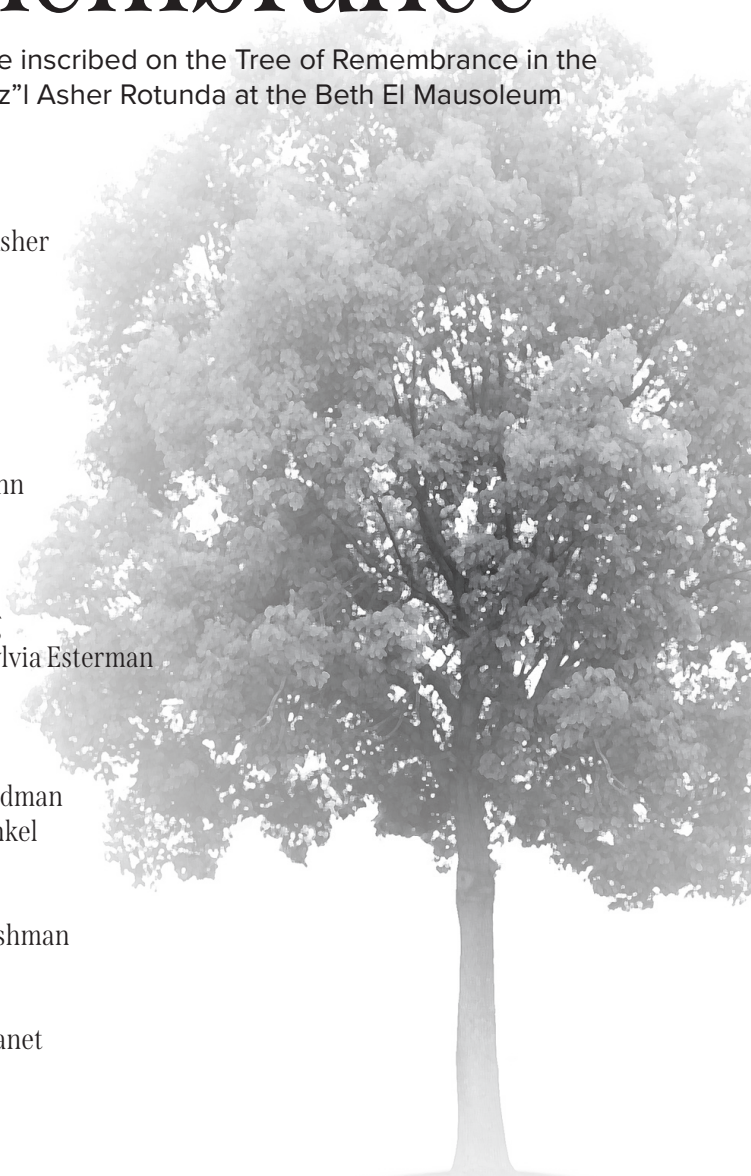
